

## **TUITION FEES GRADUATE (COURSEWORK) FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME PROGRAMMES FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021**

NTU will freeze tuition fees for Singapore Citizens enrolled in government subsidised postgraduate programmes in AY2020. This will help mitigate the impact of costs to Singaporean households during these challenging times. Postgraduate tuition fees follow a fee schedule that is set at the year of admission, with pre-planned annual adjustments over the course duration. With the freeze in tuition fees, Singaporean students from the AY2020 intake will pay the AY2019 fees in their first year of study.

For Singaporean postgraduate students from the AY2019 intake or earlier, they will pay the AY2019 fees in AY2020. The fee schedule for the remaining course duration for Singaporean graduate (coursework) students admitted in the AY2020 intake and before will be reviewed before the start of AY2021.

The freeze in tuition fees for AY2020 does not apply to fees payable by Singapore Permanent Resident (PR) and international students (IS).

### **APPLICABLE TO AY2020-2021 INTAKES ONLY (August 2020 and January 2021 Intakes)**

1. All fees listed below are in Singapore dollars (S\$). Every academic year, fees are reviewed and subject to revision. As and when fees are revised, the new fees will be applicable to all existing and new students.
  - a. The tuition fee schedule for the remaining course duration for graduate (coursework) Singaporean students admitted in AY2020 intake and before will be reviewed before the start of AY2021.
  - b. Tuition fees for students admitted in AY2020/2021 intake will be adjusted by \$50 per annum for Singapore Permanent Residents (PR) students, and \$100 per annum for International Students (IS) for the remaining course duration.
2. There are two semesters in an academic year. Fees payable every semester must be paid in advance and within the stipulated period.
3. Students who fail to pay fees within the stipulated periods can have their names struck off the register of higher degree students. A student whose name has been thus struck off but who is otherwise eligible to continue his candidature will be reinstated only after he has settled all outstanding fees and paid a re-registration fee of S\$53.50.
4. A student who withdraws or leaves the University two or more weeks after the commencement of his candidature or the commencement of the semester is liable to pay tuition fees and miscellaneous fees due for the entire semester.
5. The University's Board of Trustees reserves the right to alter fees at any time without notice.

6. There are other miscellaneous fees payable at the time of matriculation. Please refer to the section below on "[Miscellaneous Fees](#)" for more details.

7. Notes on Goods and Services Tax (GST):

For Master of Education Programme (MOE-subsidised) and Master of Teaching:

- a. For Singaporeans and Singapore Permanent Residents, the tuition fees are exclusive of GST. The GST for these students is borne by MOE.
  
- b. For international students and non-subsidised students, unless otherwise stated, the tuition fees are inclusive of 7% GST and payable by students. Where tuition fees shown exclude GST, 7% GST is applicable and payable by students.

For all other higher degree programmes:

- a. Tuition fees are inclusive of the prevailing GST.

8. Information is accurate as at 19 August 2020 and is subject to changes, if applicable

9. Unconfirmed tuition fees will be updated at a later date.

## ***Programmes Subsidised by the Ministry of Education, Singapore***

### **Eligibility Guidelines for Ministry of Education (MOE) Subsidy**

10. The substantial tuition subsidy from the Government of Singapore comes in the form of a MOE subsidy which is administered by the Ministry of Education (MOE). Students need not apply for the MOE subsidy if they are eligible.

10.1 From AY2020 intakes onwards, MA (Applied Linguistics), MSc (Life Sciences), MSc (Exercise and Sport Studies) have been converted to non-subsidised programmes.

#### 10.2 Period for MOE Subsidy

For Master of Education (all specialisations) and Master of Teaching, the MOE subsidy will cover up to the minimum course duration for part-time and full-time mode of studies for the following intakes:

#### 10.3 Students with a Higher Degree Qualification

Students who have previously enjoyed MOE subsidy in a graduate programme will not be eligible for MOE subsidy in another graduate programme at the same or lower level. Instead, such students will be liable to pay “Full Fees” for the graduate programme that they now wish to undertake. For example, students who had previously enjoyed MOE subsidy in a Masters programme and had attained the Masters degree will not be eligible for subsidy in another programme at Masters degree or lower level. In addition, if they wish to upgrade in another discipline area where the programme has a combination of Masters and PhD candidature, they will not be eligible to enjoy MOE subsidy during the Masters candidature.

#### 10.4 Transferred or Re-admitted

Students who are transferred or re-admitted within NTU or across Autonomous Universities\* will be eligible to receive MOE subsidy up to the maximum programme duration for the new programme less number of semesters of MOE subsidy received for the previous programme.

\* Autonomous Universities refer to NTU, National University of Singapore (NUS) and Singapore Management University (SMU), Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT), Singapore University of Technology and Design (SUTD) and Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS).

### **SkillsFuture Mid-Career Enhanced Subsidy for Singapore Citizens aged 40 years and above**

11. With effect from 1 July 2015, Singapore Citizens (SC) students aged 40 years and above will pay fees that are 60% lower than the standard subsidised fees payable by other Singaporean students who are below 40 years old. However, this is not applicable to students paying full fees.

## ***Programmes Not Subsidised by the Ministry of Education, Singapore***

### **Total Tuition Fee (by Course Rate)**

\* The total tuition fee for each programme is based on the total number of components (i.e. course, practicum and dissertation, where applicable) for the entire programme at the applicable per-course rate for the Academic Year. In general, practicum and dissertation components are each equivalent to two courses. Fees are billed on a semester basis for the number of courses (or equivalent) registered in the semester. The per-course rate is subject to yearly revision. Students have to pay for any component that they have to repeat.

### **Total Tuition Fee (by Academic Unit)**

The fees are billed based on the total Academic Units (AUs) of the number of courses registered in each semester.
